WHEREAS the Act to amend the Professional Code and other legislative provisions (2008, c. 11) was assented to on 5 June 2008;

WHEREAS section 227 of the Act provides that the provisions of the Act come into force on the date or dates to be set by the Government;

WHEREAS, by Order in Council 938-2008 dated 1 October 2008, the Government set 15 October 2008 as the date of coming into force of the Act to amend the Professional Code and other legislative provisions (2008, c. 11), except the provisions of sections 31 and 58, paragraph 2 of section 118 and section 120, whose date of coming into force was set at 31 January 2009 by the Government;

WHEREAS it is expedient to postpone the coming into force of paragraph 2 of section 118 and section 120 of the Act;

IT IS ORDERED, therefore, on the recommendation of the Minister of Justice:

THAT the coming into force of paragraph 2 of section 118 and section 120 of the Act to amend the Professional Code and other legislative provisions (2008, c. 11), set at 31 January 2009 by Order in Council 938-2008 dated 1 October 2008, be postponed.

Clothing industry

- Labour standards specific to certain sectors

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with sections 10 and 11 of the Regulations Act (R.S.Q., c. R-18.1), that the Regulation to amend the Regulation respecting labour standards specific to certain sectors of the clothing industry, appearing below, may be made by the Government on the expiry of 45 days following this publication.

The draft Regulation raises the minimum wage applicable to certain sectors of the clothing industry from \$8.50 per hour to \$9.00 per hour as of 1 May 2009. The four sectors of the clothing industry that are subject to the Regulation respecting labour standards specific to certain sectors of the clothing industry are the women's clothing industry, the men's clothing industry, the men's and boys' shirt industry and the leather glove industry.

The proposed increase in the minimum wage in those sectors will allow the employees to benefit from a rate equivalent to the general minimum wage rate. The increase will improve the purchasing power of low-wage earners, enabling them to participate in the general prosperity. The increase also takes into account the ability of enterprises to pay and enable them to remain competitive in those sectors of activity.

1. The Regulation respecting labour standards specific to certain sectors of the clothing industry is amended in section 3 by replacing "\$8.50" by "\$9.00".

2. This Regulation comes into force on 1 May 2009.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with sections 10 and 11 of the Regulations Act (R.S.Q., c. R-18.1), that the Regulation to amend the Regulation respecting labour standards, appearing below, may be made by the Government on the expiry of 45 days following this publication.

The draft Regulation raises the general minimum wage from \$8.50 per hour to \$9.00 per hour as of 1 May 2009. It also raises the minimum wage payable to employees who receive gratuities or tips from \$7.75 per hour to \$8.00 per hour as of 1 May 2009.

The draft Regulation also raises, as of 1 May 2009, the minimum wage payable to employees assigned to the picking of raspberries, strawberries and apples, which is established on the basis of yield, depending on the type of fruit picked.

Regulation to amend the Regulation respecting labour standards*

An Act respecting labour standards
(R.S.Q., c. N-1.1, s. 40, 1st par., s. 89, par. 1, and s. 91, 1st par.)

1. The Regulation respecting labour standards is amended in section 3 by replacing “\$8.50” by “\$9.00”.

2. Section 4 is amended by replacing “\$7.75” by “\$8.00”.

3. The first paragraph of section 4.1 is replaced by the following:

“The minimum wage payable to an employee assigned mainly to non-mechanized operations relating to the picking of raspberries, strawberries or apples is established on the basis of yield according to the following rules:

(1) for an employee assigned to the picking of raspberries: \$0.553 per 250 ml container;

(2) for an employee assigned to the picking of strawberries: \$0.251 per 551 ml container;

(3) for an employee assigned to the picking of apples:

(a) for dwarf apple trees: \$1.33 per bushel;

(b) for semi-dwarf apple trees: \$1.65 per bushel; and

(c) for standard apple trees: \$1.89 per bushel.”.

4. This Regulation comes into force on 1 May 2009.
