Education Act (chapter I-13.3)

Basic school regulation for preschool, elementary and secondary education —Amendment

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with sections 10, 11, 12 and 13 of the Regulations Act (chapter R-18.1), that the Regulation to amend the Basic school regulation for preschool, elementary and secondary education, appearing below, may be made by the Government on the expiry of 20 days following this publication.

The draft Regulation amends the lists of subjects for the second cycle of secondary school, in the general education path and applied general education path, by replacing the compulsory subject "History and citizenship education" in Secondary III and Secondary IV by the compulsory subject "Financial education" in Secondary V, by providing for an adjustment to the number of credits allocated for the compulsory subject "Contemporary world" in Secondary V, and by consequently adjusting the number of credits for elective subjects.

In accordance with sections 12 and 13 of the Regulations Act, the draft Regulation may be made at the expiry of a shorter period than the 45 days provided for in section 11 of that Act due to the urgency, in the Government's opinion, of the following circumstances:

— The Regulation must be made before the end of March 2017 so that the amendments that will come into force for the 2017-2018 school year may be known to allow the performance of various legal and contractual acts related to the organization of the 2017-2018 school year, particularly by schools and school boards, within the required time, some of which must be performed before 30 April 2017. The draft Regulation has no negative impact on small and medium-sized businesses.

2. Section 32 is amended by replacing subparagraph 5 of the first paragraph by the following:

"(5) 4 credits in Secondary IV history;".

TRANSITIONAL AND FINAL

3. For the purposes of section 32, as amended by section 2 of this Regulation, a student who has earned 4 credits in Secondary IV history and citizenship education is deemed to have earned 4 credits in Secondary IV history.

4. This Regulation comes into force on 1 July 2017.
