### O.C. 811-2020, 22 July 2020

Renewal of the public health emergency pursuant to section 119 of the Public Health Act

WHEREAS the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 to be a pandemic on 11 March 2020;

WHEREAS, under section 118 of the Public Health Act (chapter S-2.2), the Government may declare a public health emergency in all or part of the territory of Québec where a serious threat to the health of the population, whether real or imminent, requires the immediate application of certain measures provided for in section 123 of the Act to protect the health of the population;

WHEREAS the pandemic constitutes a serious and real threat to the health of the population that requires the immediate application of certain measures provided for in section 123 of the Act;

WHEREAS, under the first paragraph of section 119 of the Act, the public health emergency declared by the Government is effective for a maximum period of ten days at the expiry of which it may be renewed, as many times as necessary, for a maximum period of ten days or, with the consent of the National Assembly, for a maximum period of 30 days;

WHEREAS, under section 121 of the Act, the public health emergency is effective as soon as it is declared or renewed;

WHEREAS, while the public health emergency is in effect, despite any provision to the contrary, the Government or the Minister of Health and Social Services, if the Minister has been so empowered, may, without delay and without further formality, take any of the measures provided for in subparagraphs 1 to 8 of the first paragraph of section 123 of the Act to protect the health of the population;

WHEREAS, by Order in Council 177-2020 dated 13 March 2020, the Government declared a public health emergency and took certain measures to protect the health of the population;

WHEREAS it is expedient to order certain measures to protect the health of the population;

IT IS ORDERED, therefore, on the recommendation of the Minister of Health and Social Services:

THAT, for the purposes of this Order in Council, face covering mean a mask or tightly fitting cloth that covers the nose and the mouth;

THAT it be prohibited for an operator of a shared transportation service by bus, minibus, subway, boat, train or plane to admit a person who is not wearing a face covering, or to tolerate the presence in such means of transportation of a person not wearing a face covering, unless the person

(1) is less than 12 years of age;

(2) is a student at the preschool or elementary school level of the general education instructional services for youth and is who is in school transportation;

(3) states that the wearing of a face covering is not possible because of the person's medical condition;

(4) ordinarily works in the means of transportation;

(5) is consuming food or a beverage in an area reserved for food services or the consumption of beverages;

(6) removes the face covering momentarily to eat or drink, or for identification purposes;

(7) is on a ferry, and remains inside his or her vehicle;

THAT the prohibitions provided for in the preceding paragraph also apply, subject to the same exceptions, to the driver of a motor vehicle used for remunerated passenger transportation otherwise that as part of the operation of a shared transportation service, except in the case of carpooling;

THAT a person whose usual work place is a means of transportation referred to in the second paragraph or a motor vehicle referred to in the third paragraph remain subject to the rules that apply in matters of occupational health and safety;

THAT any person who is guilty of an offence under section 139 of the Public Health Act (chapter S-2.2) by reason of the person contravening the rules set out in this Order in Council be liable to a fine of \$400 to \$6,000;

THAT Order in Council 810-2020 dated 15 July 2020 be amended by replacing subparagraph 4 of the second paragraph of the operative part by the following:

"(4) removes the face covering momentarily to eat or drink, or for identification purposes;";

THAT the Minister of Health and Social Services be empowered to order any modification or clarification of the measures provided for in this Order in Council;

THAT this Order in Council take effect on 27 July 2020.

CONSIDERING Ministerial Order 2020-005 dated 17 March 2020, amended by Order in Council 689-2020 dated 25 June 2020, which suspends the effects of any judgment by a tribunal or any decision by the Régie du logement authorizing the repossession of a dwelling or the eviction of the lessee of a dwelling, as well as the effects of any judgment or any decision ordering the eviction of the lessee or occupant of a dwelling, unless the lessor rented the dwelling again before the coming into effect of that Ministerial Order;

CONSIDERING Ministerial Order 2020-050 dated 7 July 2020, which amends that Ministerial Order to provide that the suspension be lifted with respect to judgments or decisions rendered before 1 March 2020;

CONSIDERING that Order in Council 807-2020 dated 15 July 2020 empowers the Minister of Health and Social Services to take any measure provided for in subparagraphs 1 to 8 of the first paragraph of section 123 of the Public Health Act;

CONSIDERING that the current situation of the COVID-19 pandemic allows for the easing of certain measures set in place to protect the health of the population, while maintaining some of the measures necessary to continue that protection;

ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

THAT Ministerial Order 2020-005 dated 17 March 2020, amended by Order in Council 689-2020 dated 25 June 2020 and by Ministerial Order 2020-050 dated 7 July 2020, be revoked;

THAT this Ministerial Order take effect on 20 July 2020.

### Order number 4282 of the Chief Justice of Québec and the Minister of Justice dated 6 July 2020

Code of Civil Procedure (chapter C-25.01)

> CONCERNING the lifting of the suspension of certain time limits for extinctive prescription, forfeiture and civil proceedings

The Chief Justice of Québec and the Minister of Justice, jointly,

CONSIDERING the first paragraph of article 27 of the Code of Civil Procedure (chapter C-25.01) that states that, in a state of emergency declared by the Government, the Chief Justice of Québec and the Minister of Justice may jointly suspend or extend a prescription or procedural period for a specified time in the manner they specify;

CONSIDERING the second paragraph of the said article that states that their decision takes effect immediately;

CONSIDERING order in council 177-2020 dated March 13, 2020, which declares a public health emergency throughout Québec for a period of 10 days;

CONSIDERING that the public health emergency was renewed until March 29, 2020, by order in council 222-2020 dated March 20, 2020, until April 7, 2020, by order in council 388-2020 dated March 29, 2020, until April 16, 2020, by order in council 418-2020 dated April 7, 2020, until April 24, 2020, by order in council 460-2020 dated April 15, 2020, until April 29, 2020, by order in council 478-2020 dated April 22, 2020, until May 6, 2020, by order in council 483-2020 dated April 29, 2020, until May 13, 2020, by order in council 501-2020 dated May 6, 2020, until May 20, 2020, by order in council 509-2020, dated May 13, 2020, until May 27, 2020, by order in council 531-2020 dated May 20, 2020, until June 3, 2020, by order in council 544-2020 dated May 27, 2020, until June 10, 2020, by order in council 572-2020 dated June 3, 2020, until June 17, 2020, by order in council 593-2020 dated June 10, 2020, until June 23, 2020, by order in council 630-2020 dated June 17, 2020, until June 30, 2020, by order in council 667-2020 dated June 23, 2020, and until July 8, 2020, by order in council 690-2020 dated June 30, 2020;

CONSIDERING Order 2020-4251 of the Chief Justice of Québec and the Minister of Justice dated March 15, 2020, which suspends, as long as the public health emergency declared by order in council 177-2020 dated March 13, 2020, is renewed, the time limits for extinctive prescription, forfeiture in civil matters, and civil proceedings, except, in the latter case, for matters deemed urgent by the courts;

CONSIDERING that it is necessary to lift the suspension of certain time limits for civil proceedings to allow, among other things, the enforcement of judgments by a court or decisions by the Régie du logement ordering the repossession of a dwelling or the eviction of a tenant of a dwelling or ordering the expulsion of a tenant or occupant of a dwelling;

ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

THAT the suspension of time limits for extinctive prescription, forfeiture and civil proceedings related to repossession of a dwelling, eviction of a tenant of a dwelling or expulsion of a tenant or occupant of a dwelling be lifted on July 6, 2020;

THAT, notwithstanding the foregoing and subject to matters deemed urgent by the courts in accordance with the second paragraph of Order 2020-4251, the suspension of time limits for appeals and enforcement of judgments by a court or decisions by the Régie du logement rendered on or after March 1, 2020, and ordering the repossession of a dwelling or the eviction of a tenant of a dwelling or ordering the expulsion of a tenant or occupant of a dwelling be lifted on July 20, 2020.
