The amendments proposed by the Regulation concern the diplomas issued by teaching establishments which give access to the permit of the Ordre professionnel des acupuncteurs du Québec. It is thus proposed to add a section to the Regulation in order to determine that the diploma of college studies awarded by the Minister of Education following the completion of studies in traditional acupuncture at Collège de Rosemont gives access to the permit issued by the Ordre des acupuncteurs du Québec.

R-18.1), that the Bureau of the Ordre des denturologistes du Québec adopted, at its meeting of 25 January 2002, the Regulation respecting the standards for training or diploma equivalence for the issuing of a permit by the Ordre des denturologistes du Québec.

The text which appears below will be subject to examination by the Office des professions du Québec pursuant to section 95 of the Professional Code. Then, it will be submitted, with the recommendation of the Office, to the Government which, pursuant to the same section, may approve it, with or without amendment, upon the expiry of 45 days from this publication.

According to the Ordre des denturologistes du Québec, the Regulation

- (1) specifies, pursuant to paragraph c of section 93 of the Professional Code, equivalence standards for diplomas issued by educational institutions outside Québec, for issuing a permit and training equivalence standards for a person who does not hold the diploma required; and
- (2) has no impact on businesses, whether small and medium sized businesses or others.
