Basic vocational training — Amendments

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with sections 10 and 11 of the Regulations Act (R.S.Q., c. R-18.1), that the Regulation to amend the Basic vocational training regulation, the text of which appears below, may be made by the Government on the expiry of 45 days following this publication.

The purpose of the draft Regulation is to adapt the Basic vocational training regulation according to the amendments to be made to the Basic school regulation for preschool, elementary and secondary education. The draft Regulation proposes

— to revoke the provisions relating to an Attestation of Vocational Education; and

— to amend section 19 relating to communications provided by the vocational training centre to the parents of minors who take general education courses offered by the centre concurrently with the vocational training courses.

The draft Regulation has no negative impact on citizens or small and medium-sized businesses.

Regulation to amend the Basic vocational training regulation*

Education Act
(R.S.Q., c. I-13.3, s. 448)

1. The Basic vocational training regulation is amended by deleting paragraph 1 of section 4.

2. Section 11 is revoked.

3. Section 19 is amended

(1) by replacing the first paragraph by the following:

“The vocational training centre shall provide the parents of minors with at least four communications per year concerning general education courses offered by the centre and taken concurrently with the vocational training courses. The communications must include two report cards and an end-of-year report.”;

(2) by replacing “The reports” in the second paragraph by “The report card”;

(3) by replacing subparagraph 15 of the second paragraph by the following:

“(15) an indication of the level of development achieved by the student in the year or cycle, for each of the competencies described in the programs of studies for the subjects being taught.”;

(4) by deleting subparagraph 16 of the second paragraph.

4. The following is inserted after section 19:

“**19.1.** At the end of each year, the centre shall send to the parents of minors an end-of-year report for the general education courses the minor has taken at the centre.

The report must include

(1) an indication of the level of development achieved by the student, for each of the competencies described in the programs of studies for the subjects being taught;

(2) the results for each program of studies and, where applicable, the credits for the programs; and

(3) an overall rating of the student to facilitate the student's academic progress and continuation of studies.

The student's end-of-year report is based on competency levels established by the Minister for the programs of studies for the subjects being taught.

The results referred to in subparagraph 2 are expressed in the form of marks.”.

5. Section 21 is revoked.

6. Despite section 5 of this Regulation, a person who has been admitted to a vocational training program leading to an Attestation of Vocational Education before 1 July 2007, in accordance with section 11 of the Basic vocational training regulation as it read on 30 June 2007, is subject to the rules governing certification of studies set out in section 21 of the Basic vocational training regulation as it read on that date.

7. This Regulation comes into force on 1 July 2005 except sections 1, 2 and 5 which come into force on 1 July 2007.
