ATTENDU QUE le premier alinéa de l'article 48 de la Loi sur la justice administrative (L.R.Q., c. J-3) prévoit notamment que le mandat d'un membre du Tribunal administratif du Québec est renouvelé pour cinq ans;

ATTENDU QUE l'article 49 de cette loi énonce que le renouvellement du mandat d'un membre est examiné suivant la procédure établie par règlement du gouvernement et qu'un tel règlement peut notamment fixer la composition des comités et le mode de nomination de leurs membres, lesquels ne doivent pas faire partie de l'Administration gouvernementale au sens de la Loi sur l'administration publique (L.R.Q., c. A-6.01), ni la représenter;

ATTENDU QUE l'article 57 de la Loi sur la justice administrative précise que le gouvernement fixe, conformément au règlement qu'il a édicté par le décret numéro 318-98 du 18 mars 1998, modifié par le décret numéro 1180-2002 du 2 octobre 2002, en application de l'article 56 de cette loi, la rémunération, les avantages sociaux et les autres conditions de travail des membres de ce Tribunal;

ATTENDU QUE le Dr Jean-François Lacerte a été nommé membre médecin psychiatre à temps partiel du Tribunal administratif du Québec, affecté à la section des affaires sociales, par le décret numéro 852-2000 du 28 juin 2000 et que son mandat viendra à échéance le 30 juillet 2005;

ATTENDU QUE conformément à l'article 26 du Règlement sur la procédure de recrutement et de sélection des personnes aptes à être nommées membres du Tribunal administratif du Québec et sur celle de renouvellement du mandat de ces membres, édicté par le décret numéro 317-98 du 18 mars 1998, modifié par le décret numéro 1179-2002 du 2 octobre 2002, le secrétaire général associé respon-

C-25) permet au gouvernement de déclarer insaisissables, pour la période qu'il détermine, les œuvres d'art ou biens historiques qui proviennent de l'extérieur du Québec et y sont exposés publiquement ou sont destinés à l'être, dans la mesure où ces œuvres ou ces biens n'ont pas été à l'origine conçus, produits ou réalisés au Québec;

ATTENDU QUE Clear Channel Entertainment Foundation for the Arts présentera, du 4 juin 2005 au 18 septembre 2005, l'exposition « Saint-Pierre et le Vatican : L'Héritage des Papes » ;

ATTENDU QUE les œuvres d'art et biens historiques mentionnés à la liste ci-jointe et exposés publiquement au Québec dans le cadre de cette exposition proviennent de l'extérieur du Québec et n'ont pas été à l'origine conçus, produits ou réalisés au Québec ;

ATTENDU QU'il y a lieu de déclarer l'insaisissabilité des œuvres et biens mentionnés à la liste ci-jointe, de même que toute autre œuvre d'art et tout bien historique qui pourront s'y ajouter dans le cadre de l'exposition « Saint-Pierre et le Vatican : L'Héritage des Papes », et ce, à compter de leur date d'arrivée, soit le ou vers le 18 mai 2005 ;

QUE les œuvres d'art et biens historiques provenant de l'extérieur du Québec et n'ayant pas été à l'origine conçus, produits ou réalisés au Québec, dont la liste apparaît en annexe, et qui seront exposés du 4 juin 2005 au 18 septembre 2005 à la Basilique Notre-Dame de Montréal, dans le cadre de l'exposition « Saint-Pierre et le Vatican : L'Héritage des Papes », ainsi que toute autre œuvre d'art et tout bien historique qui pourront s'y ajouter et qui n'ont pas été à l'origine conçus, produits ou réalisés au Québec, soient déclarés insaisissables à compter de leur date d'arrivée, soit le ou vers le 18 mai 2005 ;

QUE cette insaisissabilité demeure en vigueur jusqu'au moment du départ du Québec de ces œuvres d'art et biens historiques, et de toute œuvre d'art et tout bien historique qui pourront s'y ajouter dans le cadre de l'exposition « Saint-Pierre et le Vatican : L'Héritage des Papes », soit le ou vers le 30 septembre 2005 ;
