

**M.O., 2009****Order number AM 2009-005 of the minister of Natural Resources and Wildlife and the minister for Natural resources and wildlife dated 20 February 2009**

An Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife  
(R.S.Q., c. C-61.1)

CONCERNING the Fishing and Hunting Areas Regulation\*

THE MINISTER OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND WILDLIFE AND THE MINISTER FOR NATURAL RESOURCES AND WILDLIFE,

CONSIDERING that the Government made the Fishing and Hunting Areas Regulation by Order in Council 27-90 dated 10 January 1990;

CONSIDERING section 84.1 of the Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife (R.S.Q., c. C-61.1) which provides that the Minister may divide Québec into hunting areas, fishing areas or trapping areas, and delimit the areas;

CONSIDERING section 84.3 of the Act which provides that an order made by the Minister under section 84.1 of this Act must be published in the *Gazette officielle du Québec* and comes into force on the date of its publication or on any later date indicated therein;

CONSIDERING that it is expedient to replace Schedules XV and XXVI to the Fishing and Hunting Areas Regulation to modify the delimitation of fishing and hunting Areas 15 and 26;

ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

Schedules XV and XXVI to the Fishing and Hunting Areas Regulation are replaced by Schedules XV and XXVI attached hereto;

This Order comes into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette officielle du Québec*.

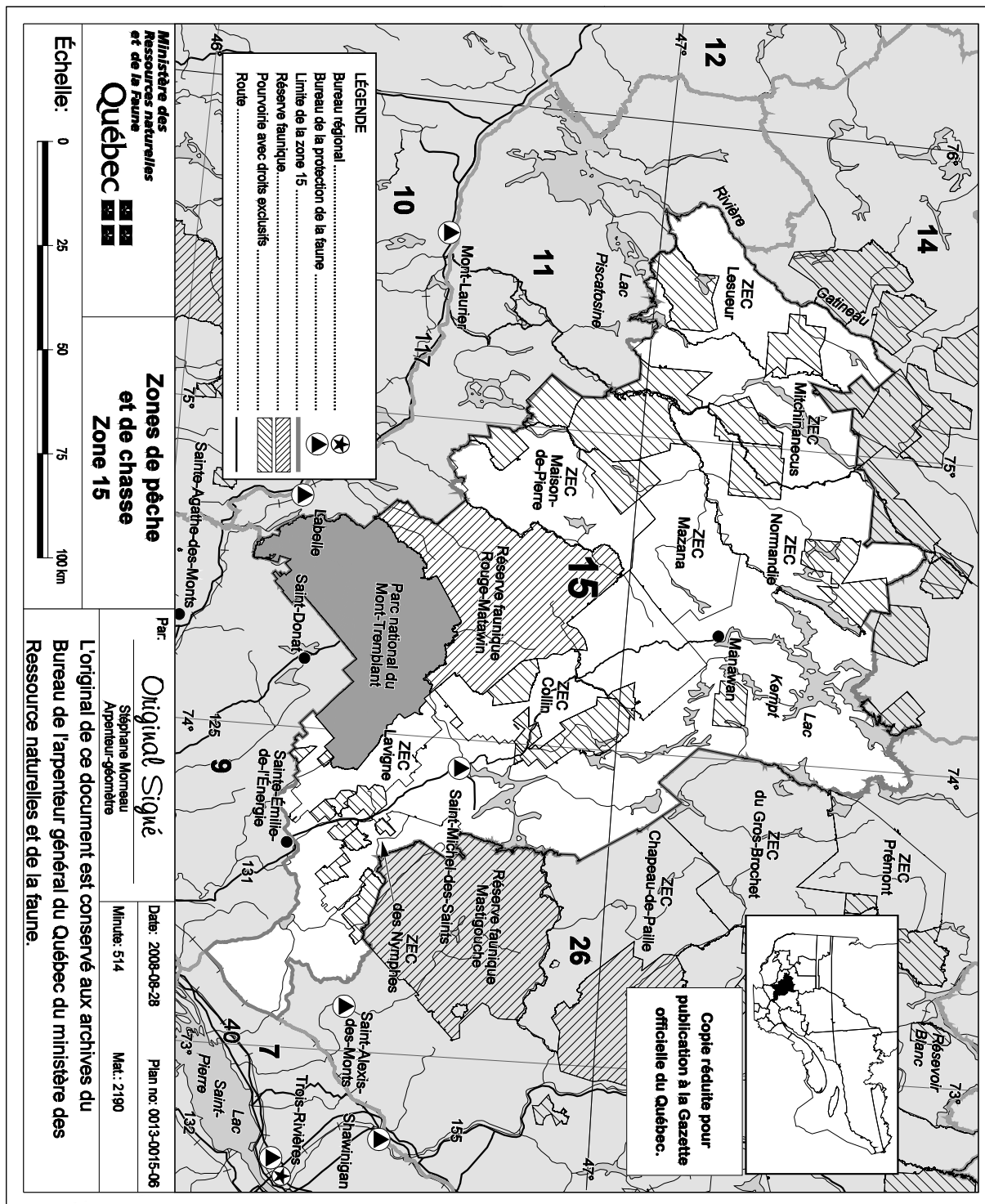
