Order number AM 2018-004 of the Minister of Forests, Wildlife and Parks dated 19 March 2018

An Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife (chapter C-61.1)

CONCERNING the Regulation to amend the Regulation respecting hunting

THE MINISTER OF FORESTS, WILDLIFE AND PARKS,

CONSIDERING subparagraph 3 of the first paragraph of section 163 of the Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife (chapter C-61.1), which provides that the Minister may make regulations establishing the requirements that a holder of a licence, certificate, authorization or lease must satisfy;

CONSIDERING the first paragraph of section 164 of the Act, which provides in particular that a regulation made under subparagraphs 1 to 3 of the first paragraph of section 163 of the Act is not subject to the publication requirements set out in section 8 of the Regulations Act (chapter R-18.1);

CONSIDERING the making of the Regulation respecting hunting (chapter C-61.1, r. 12);

CONSIDERING that it is expedient to amend certain provisions of the Regulation;

ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

The Regulation to amend the Regulation respecting hunting, attached hereto, is hereby made.

Regulation to amend the Regulation respecting hunting

An Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife (chapter C-61.1, s. 163, 1st par., subpar. 3)

1. The Regulation respecting hunting (chapter C-61.1, r. 12) is amended in section 13.9

(1) by inserting “moose,” after “When hunting” in the second paragraph;

(2) by adding the following at the end:

“Despite the second paragraph, the licence holder who hunts moose south of the 52nd parallel is not required to use the services of an outfitting operation or to hunt in a wildlife sanctuary or in a controlled zone if the holder

(1) is a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police or the Canadian Armed Forces and exercises duties in Québec or resided in Québec immediately before establishing residence outside Québec for the exercise of duties;

(2) is a member of a diplomatic mission or a consular corps, including a member of the service staff, established in Québec; or

(3) is accompanied by an immediate family member who is a resident holding a moose hunting licence, valid or having expired, if issued in the latter case between 1 April and 31 March of the current year.

For the purposes of subparagraph 3 of the third paragraph, the holder’s immediate family members are the holder’s grandparents, parents, brothers, sisters, spouse, children, grandchildren and the spouse’s children and grandchildren.”

2. This Regulation comes into force on the fifteenth day following the date of its publication in the *Gazette officielle du Québec*.

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
